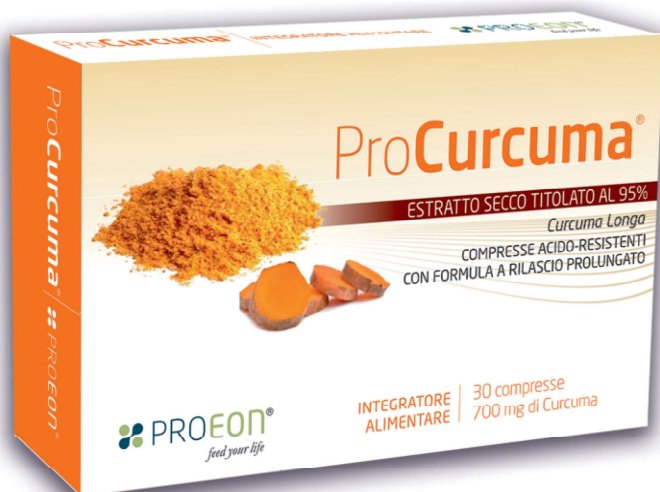


# ProCurcuma

Curcuma (Turmeric) rhizome is rich in curcuminoids, of which **Curcumin** is the most important, with proven multiple beneficial effects on human health.

Physiological effects of Curcuma rhizome: **antioxidant**, of help in any **inflammatory process, liver detoxification**, improved **gastrointestinal function**; it combats menstrual disorders and it is of help in neurodegenerative diseases, infections and in immunitary diseases; it reduces sport activity catabolites.




WHEN USING PROCURCUMA

On the basis of the international literature its indications are:

- **inflammatory processes** in general (osteo-arthro-muscle-ligament diseases, neuritis, dermatitis and soft tissue alterations) <sup>(1-4)</sup>, without the typical side effects of non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs and corticoids;
- **Oxidative Stress** and free radical excessive formation <sup>(2)</sup>;
- chronic **Liver Diseases** (hepatitis/steatosis, liver insufficiency) <sup>(5,6)</sup>;
- **Inflammatory Intestine Diseases** (Chron disease, Ulcerative Colitis, Irritable Bowel) <sup>(7,8)</sup>;
- **gastroduodenitis** <sup>(7)</sup>;
- **menstrual disorders** <sup>(9)</sup>;
- **neurodegenerative diseases** (Alzheimer, Parkinson, dementia) <sup>(1, 10, 11)</sup>;
- inflammatory **skin disorders**, skin ulcers <sup>(12,13)</sup>;
- **support during cancer treatment** <sup>(1, 4, 6, 10, 14)</sup>.





PROCURCUMA is a unique nutraceutical for composition and quality.

- **High dose (700 mg)**, of which **600 mg dry extract** of Rhizome, with 95% titration for Curcumins and 100 mg of Rhizome powder.
- Increased **bioavailability (2000% increase)** due to the association with piperine.
- Coated, **gastro-resistant** tablets with **slow-release** formula.

**Ingredients:** Curcuma (Turmeric, Curcuma longa L.syn. domestic Turmeric Valetón) rhizome dry extract, titred at 95% of total curcuminoids (on corn maltodextrines); black pepper (Piper nigrum L.) 95% dry extract of Piperine; anti-agglomerating agents: silicon dioxide, magnesium salts of fatty acids; coating agents: hydroxypropylmethylcellulose, talc, glycerol; cover agents: shellac, acetic acid esters of mono- and diglycerides of fatty acids, polyvinylpyrrolidone.

**30 tablets 700 mg of Curcuma - Net weight: g 30 C - How to use:** 1-2 tablets daily possibly at meals
